November 6 – Guide Dogs 2pm

Joselyn Hargrove has raised 39 guide dogs to be used by the sight impaired and veterans who suffer from posttraumatic stress syndrome. She is a member of the South Eastern Guide Dogs Association and has been volunteering for over 25 years. Joselyn will be talking to us about the work she does in preparing these dogs to go to their new owners.


