We are happy to announce that our hospitality roster is filling up at a record pace.

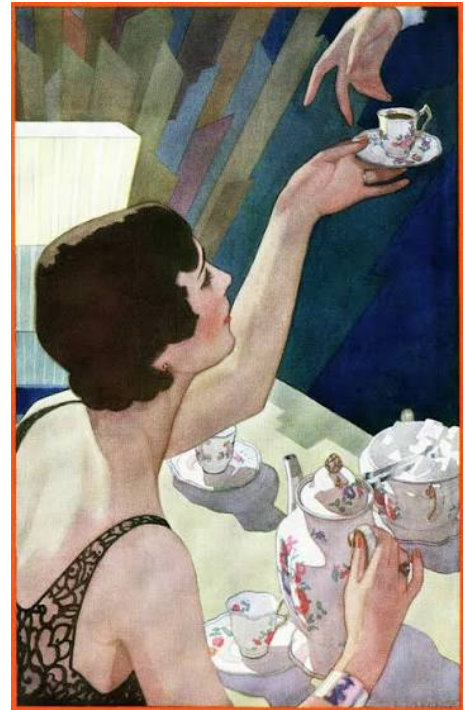
So many of you are kindly donating your time, your energy and your sandwiches and cookies to making our club a welcoming place for all.

A fun photograph from our Woman's Club of Winter Park Archival Collection! This photograph was taken at an event on December 19, 1956. Notice behind the ladies standing on the stage that the three sets of beautiful shuttered windows and two of the transom windows are open. In the original design of the building, the shuttered and transom windows not only provided another interesting architectural element and natural light source into the space, but also allowed a cooling cross draft, pre-air conditioning, with the Terrace doors on the other side of the Helen Morse Hall. Please take a moment to walk outside the Clubhouse and around to an often overlooked side of the building to fully appreciate not only the windows, but also the lush garden area.
