Charitable Giving



Spotlight on an Exemplary Member

If you have been reading the monthly issues of the Woman's Club Highlights for several years, you may remember previous articles that shine a spotlight on a new member, or perhaps, one who has been a member for a long time. This month, I want to write about Monica Clarke, whose quiet lights of leadership, dedication, kindness and friendship mean so much to our club.

Monica and I had tea at Panera's this month and I learned a number of interesting things about her. She was born in Rochester, N. Y. and also taught for 12 years at three small Catholic Schools. Monica earned her bachelor's degree from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh and later, a Master's degree in Teaching at Rollins College. When her sister and brother-in-law moved to Winter Park, Florida, she also thought it was a good idea to get away from harsh winters and join them. Monica found a job she loved at St. Andrew's Catholic School in Pine Hills and she remained there for 29 vears. She attributes her successes there to having such a trusting administration and opportunities to teach different grades (5th, 7th and 8th). She particularly enjoyed teaching American History, English and Science. In science classes for several years the students enjoyed watching chickens hatch and raising them for 3 weeks before the chicks found a home at a nearby farm. Launching model rockets was another favorite project, and Monica often retrieved the spent rockets from the roof of the school. During a field trip to Gatorland,



Monica and some students posed for pictures. They were holding a boa constrictor and a baby alligator. I could tell from her enthusiasm, that she truly loved her students and opportunities to learn with them. Monica retired from teaching to take care of her ailing mother, who has since passed away.

In 2006, Monica learned about the Woman's Club of Winter Park from some of her friends at St. Margaret Mary Catholic Church. She soon started working on committees and was recognized for her dedication and ability to organize and teach others. Within a year or so, she was Chair of the Program Committee. That is where I met her and I will never forget the lovely lunch she had for committee members at her house. It was there that we began our planning. She really had her "ducks in a row" but was also a skillful leader, who brought out the ideas of others. The committee worked like a "textbook case" and it was a very successful year. After two years as Program Chair, she became Chair of Charitable Giving, one of the most demanding jobs in the club. She had a responsive committee, however, and she knew how to motivate the members, keep excellent committee notes and begin to put a monetary value on all our contributions such as teddy bears and purple bags. This was important for our new status as a 501c3. Because of her excellent organization skills, Monica was drafted for the Hospitality Committee next. She graciously accepted and began to organize a myriad of tasks that must be completed in a timely manner each week. She even held some "coaching sessions" for us and the kitchen and tea parties have never run so smoothly.

I believe that Monica is the happiest when she is making important contributions to our club. She loves that opportunity to get to know so many of our friendly and interesting members. She truly enjoys everyone and appreciates how members are eager to help to make our club a success. I asked her what she wants to do next. She admitted with a shy smile, that she wants to sit back and "rest" for at least a year. But I know that in her quiet way, she will be helping all of us enjoy our club, our work and each other. Thank you, Monica, for being such an exemplary member.
