Did You Know? By Kim Mould


As the Depression years of the 1930's wore on, American clubwomen struggled to adjust to economic downturns, while confronting the growing, undeniable threat of Nazi Germany. In 1938, times were turning darker. In March, Germany invaded Austria. By October, the passports of German Jews were declared invalid. *Kristallnacht*, the arrest and killing of countless Jews and the rampant destruction of Jewish businesses and synagogues throughout Germany by Nazi troops and sympathizers on November 9 – 10th, shocked the world. In the ensuing years, millions of Jews were tormented, stripped of their rights, uprooted and resettled in dismal ghettos, slaughtered outright, or faced certain death in hell-on-earth concentration camps. Americans regarded the gathering storms of war with equal amounts of alarm, horror, and disbelief. American clubwomen, including the members of the Woman's Club of Winter Park, seriously studied the dire array of national and international events, issues, and problems, and they wholeheartedly committed themselves, their energies, and their finances to communal change through positive action and intellectual uplift.

Members of the Woman's Club of Winter Park have always regarded quality education, for both children and young adults, as a critical cornerstone of a healthy, flourishing community. In 1938, the Scholarship Committee was organized and the first appeals went out for subscribers to start a Scholarship Endowment Fund. The action passed on January 14, 1938 resolved: "that this Club create a fund by private annual contribution as a scholarship fund to assist any boy or girl in Orange County who possess good mental ability and who is of good character and is worthy of assistance..." Dr. Helen W. Cole, Woman's Club President, and Mrs. Mary Holmes Bartlett, Scholarship Committee Chair, urged members to give generously. As Mrs. Bartlett wrote in a later appeal to members dated January 1, 1940, "Boys and girls of today step out of school into a chaotic world, faced by all the problems we have failed to solve. The least we can do is give them all the preparation they are capable of using and willing to work for. Let's begin the new year by a generous salute to those who are about to carry on for us."

Early contributions to the fund came from book and calendar sales, "card parties, bake sales, flea markets and fashion shows," but eventually generous bequests made by members and "sustaining contributors" enabled the establishment of an endowment. The first two recipients awarded scholarships were Franklin McKnight, a male student at Bolles Military School in Jacksonville, and Helen Flume, a female Rollins College student who received \$200. For the 1938 – 1939 Rollins school year, tuition, room, and board was \$1,345. In comparison, according to the Rollins Office of Admissions, tuition, room, and on-campus board for the 2015 – 2016 school year is \$58,670!

Two wonderful letters recently contributed to the Woman's Club of Winter Park Archives by member Mary Ann Page, also known as Winkie Colado, document her experiences with the "Scholarship Loan Fund Committee" in the 1950s. One letter, dated May 23, 1952, which begins "My dear Winkie," indicates the Scholarship Loan Fund Committee had granted her request for \$150 for the 1953 – 1954 school year. A second letter, dated April 18, 1959, expresses how much her "payment on the scholarship loan was appreciated" by the Committee.

As the March 1, 2016 deadline approaches for scholarship applications, Barbara Hughes, Scholarship Committee Chair, and the Scholarship Committee continue a proud club tradition of generously providing financial awards for worthy students as part of the Woman's Club of Winter Park's most significant, consistent, and substantial philanthropic project, the Scholarship Fund.
