

2016 - 2017 Charitable Giving Donations

It has been a real pleasure to serve as the Chair of Charitable Giving for the past two years. With the support and advice of an outstanding board and president, and especially from our wonderful ladies who contributed their time, talents, and donations, Charitable Giving had a very successful year.

A total of **\$5,600.00** was donated to the following organizations:

Welbourne Avenue Nursery & Kindergarten, Central Florida Vocal Arts, Dress for Success, Adult Literacy League, Family Promise of Greater Orlando, Neighbors Network, A gift for Teaching, Orlando Union Rescue Mission, and Eti-Keys Training Group, Inc.

In-Kind donations for our annual projects included Christmas stockings for the Salvation Army, Christmas gifts for the children of the four families selected by the Winter Park Housing Authority, purple bags with personal hygiene items for the Orlando Union Rescue Mission, and gently used clothing and accessories for Dress for Success. New this year was donations of move-in kits for Family Promise of Greater Orlando. In addition there were donations of diapers and baby products for the Welbourne Nursery and Kindergarten, food and clothing for Fern Creek Elementary, and clothing for the Orlando Union Rescue Mission. In-Kind donations were valued at \$8,852.00.

Total of monetary and in-kind donations is \$14,452.00.

May, 2016 ...The "New Club Year" begins, and for the House Committee, our summer was another busy one! Our new Lyman Entrance was first on the agenda. Frank Roark, Rebecca Talbert, and their crews created this next enhancement completing our exterior projects, following the Roof and Terrace, as part of our total Preservation efforts 2015-16. We love the compliments about how the entry appears to have always been there, the attention to details (with the added input from Kim Mould) were of paramount importance.

Next with the help of "our Freddy and Ken," we tackled the Archive renovation. First it was necessary to completely clear the room. All of the cleaning and paper supplies were moved to share the AV/Linen storage room, causing other maintenance items and some Club Seasonal decorating items to be moved to the basement where Freddy did a superb job of cleaning up! Then, the windows, doors, and walls, were ready to be repaired & painted, shutters added, all to make the room a bit more environmentally/archive friendly. Bass flooring did a beautiful job of refinishing the original pine floors, we added picture rail and moldings, trimmed out the deskwork area, and added new shelving. And finally, the room is ready to house the newly organized archive collection ...one guess who helped with that? Yes, Kim Mould, and at the same time she jumped in and helped with the complete inventory of the entire Club!

August, 2016 ...Ordered 15 New 60" Round banquet tables and retired, the very tired, heavy old wood ones at the rummage sale. The Amvets gratefully removed them along with our other donations at the end of the day. Ken made the table/chair storage room door, into a sliding one, to accommodate the new table cart and make the job of getting items for set up to the ballroom much easier.

Following the rummage sale, Freddy, Sammy and Ken did a major inside and out cleaning- including paint touch-ups, antique furniture polishing, windows & all trim and moldings cleaned, power washing, etc. etc. Now we were ready to greet our ladies at the Fall Membership Tea. Everything really sparkled and with the addition of the new Entry and the Archive Room our ladies were treated to a special Welcome Back! Then ...in October, hurricane Matthew attempted to make an appearance. However, we were prepared. Maureen had the large trees trimmed and several of our members helped tape cracks in all of the doors and windows and lots of towels on the sills and thresholds. As you know, Matthew took a detour and pretty much passed us by with little rain, however still managed to litter our beautiful grounds. Guess who was the first on site and already had several of our bins filled before anyone else checked in?? Yes...Freddy!!

Other projects and goals on our agenda this past year included revising our Club Rental Contract. We felt certain changes and additions were necessary to enforce expectations in maintaining our beautiful Historical Venue. A huge thank you to Kyle for the many hours researching other local venues as well as obtaining contracts, to compare, from other historical sites of similar size around the country. Our Board of Directors, (thank you for the tweaks! Meredith Murphy, Parliamentarian) approved a new contract that was effective Feb. 1, 2017. Existing Contracts through 2017 have been sent an addendum with the revised information, as stated previously; changes (other than Rental Fees) could be made at any time prior to the event.

We continue to reap the benefits of several cost cutting measures implemented during the past 18 months. The water well has already paid for itself, especially during our drought, and we have finished installing energy saving bulbs (and less heat) in all of our fixtures and chandeliers. Our new office printer capability has reduced our outside printing budget significantly. And we continue to have special ladies (and their husbands) show up on our doorstep to help with donations of their time and talents whenever there is a need. I won't name names, for fear of excluding someone, but you know who you are and our Club is only better because of you! Thank you all for another great year!! ~Karen

Pretzel Salad Recipe (from Chris Bush)

2 c. crushed pretzels

2 T. sugar

3/4 c. butter, melted

1 8oz. cream cheese

1 c. sugar

1 12oz. Cool Whip

1 large pkg. strawberry jello

2- 10oz.pkgs. frozen strawberries, cut up (use frozen, not packed in syrup.)

Mix first 3 ingredients and press in 9 x 13 pan. Bake at 400 for 8 minutes. Cool well. Blend cream cheese, sugar, and Cool Whip. Spread mixture over crust. Dissolve Jello in 2 c. boiling water. Stir in frozen strawberries. Spread on top of cream cheese mixture. Chill overnight or until firm. Serves 12
