Much Requested Recipes From Our Own Judy Allen

TACO LASAGNA

(Taste of Home 100 Most Requested Recipes, Serves 9)



1 pound ground beef
2/3 cup chopped green pepper
½ cup chopped onion
2/3 cup water
1 3nvelope taco seasoning
1 can 915 ounces) back beans, rinsed and
Drained
1 can (14½ ounces) Mexican diced
Tomatoes, undrained
6 flour tortillas (8 inches)
1 can (16 ounces) refried beans
3 cups (12 ounces) shredded Mexican
cheese blend.

In a large skillet, cook the beef, green pepper and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Add water and taco seasoning; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, for 2 minutes. Stir in black beans and tomatoes. Simmer, uncovered, for 10 minutes.

Place two tortillas in a greased 13-in.x 9-in. baking dish. Spread with half of the refried beans and beef mixture; sprinkle with 1 cup cheese. Repeat layers. Top with remaining tortillas and cheese.

Cover and bake at 350 for 25-30 minutes or until heated through and cheese is melted.

CLEAR-THE-CUPBOARD COOKIES

(Yields 4 ½ dozen cookies)



1 cup shortening
1 cup granulated sugar
1 cup brown sugar
2 large eggs
2 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup uncooked oats
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup flaked coconut
1 cup crisp rice cereal
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup pecans, chopped

Beat shortening at medium speed with electric mixer until fluffy; add sugars, beating well. Add eggs, beating until blended. Combine flour, oats, baking soda, baking powder, and salt; gradually add to sugar mixture, beating until blended. Stir in coconut, cereal, vanilla, and pecans.

Drop by table spoonfuls onto baking sheets.

Bake in batches at 350 for 12 minutes or until lightly golden.

Remove to wire racks to cool.
