This event allows the Woman's Club to financially contribute and support several organizations in need. Over the summer we received Thank You Notes from organizations that benefited from last year's fundraising events:

- Poodle and Pooch Rescue of Florida: Marilyn Cromer reported that our funds were used to provide surgery for a dog that was going to be euthanized, and after the successful surgery, was readopted by another family.
- Tia Aery, Executive Director of Family Promise wrote: "Your donation helps families who are homeless find a pathway back to independent living."
- Lui Damiani, Executive Director of the Victim Service Center stated: "Last year, the care team responded to 2,046 crisis calls, collected DNA evidence for 342 victims of sexual assault and conducted 2,062 individual and group therapy sessions. Your contribution allows us to serve victims in Central Florida and provide life changing support needed through the healing journey."
