Geri Throne was born and raised in Essex County, New Jersey. A graduate of Syracuse University, she had a career as a journalist before turning to fiction and creative writing. For more than 41 years now, she has lived here in Winter Park. She is now retired from the Orlando Sentinel; where she was a reporter, an assignment editor, a Deputy Business editor and a member of the Editorial Board.
