

Our mission is to develop, fund, and scale solutions to the world's most pressing environmental challenges. We lead monthly environmental education and eco-action projects related to the sustainable focus areas of Energy, Water, Food, Waste, and Ecology across 12 branches worldwide. trauma were in the lives of its victims. As the years went by and One Purse was serving many different populations of vulnerable women and children, a pattern emerged, and she identified an underserved and unique place of need among survivors of trafficking. Today, One Purse empowers survivors of sex trafficking to build healthy and sustainable lives.

Heather has a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Human Resource Management from the University of Central Florida and a Master of Arts in Evangelism and Leadership from Wheaton College. She has four children and lives in Winter Park with her husband.


